# June 14, 2023 Council Meeting Highlights

### Meeting held in HTLC Gathering Area

PASTOR'S REPORT

- Pastor Kristin met with Father Daniel from St. Gabriel, and is excited about moving forward.
- We welcomed new members
- We will have a baptism on June 25.
- We will welcome a visiting Pastor and his family in August as they ride their bikes across the country.
- Confirmation will be August 6.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

• Kristin Shultz reported that our financial condition has improved due to generous contributions

#### **TEAM REPORTS**

- **Property:** 
  - \* We received a tree donation from Leigh Johanneck
  - Gas stove modification will go forward, was previously approved pending funding
  - \* We thank Matt Shultz for his work on the property, and he is always in need of volunteers
- **FELLOWSHIP**: Food trucks will be here the third Wednesdays of July, August, September. We will advertise locally

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

• **Bookkeeping and Payroll Vendor Approval**: We discussed outsourcing bookkeeping and payroll to Clergy Financial Resources. Pastor Kristin and Andrea Barron spoke with them about their services in May. Cost is \$152 per month, after \$150 set up for payroll, Bookkeeping is a \$500 set up fee, then \$500 per month for bookkeeping.

We would like to be able to transition while Juli Geyser is still here. After time for discussion, a motion was made to proceed with Clergy Financial for our payroll and bookkeeping services. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

- Property Proposals:
  - Knox Box We would use a Knox Box to keep a Firefighter key and other emergency supplies outside. Total cost is \$522. A motion was made to approve. Motion was seconded and approved unanimously.
  - Landscaping We recommend improving our landscaping, including planting beds around the front sign and new trees. Total cost for Meadow Farm Nursery to perform services would be \$2,022 pending fund-

ing. Motion to approve pending funding was made and seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

 Refrigerant – Due to declining refrigerant supply, we are looking to buy now for \$1300 (30 lb.). Contractor would store and maintain pending a need for it. After



seconded and passed unanimously.

 Revised Building Use Agreement/Policy – We have revised to incorporate suggestions and changes. After discussion a motion was made to approve the form document. Motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- Congregational Meeting follow-up Rita Sims commented that it was good to see so many members at the meeting.
- Worship Volunteers We will continue to seek more tellers, coffee hosts, and ushers.

# **Property Summary**

Over the last several weeks, the Property Committee worked on the following:

- Checked out the Lawn Boy mower. Will need a new case-hardened bolt and washer. Blade appears still in balance. Have mower in my shop at the moment to repair.
- Took 4 8' bulbs to be recycled locally. Removed the 4' bulbs and have packed in a recycle box. Need a few more to completely fill and ship.
- Picked up batteries for Fire Exit Lighting. Placed in box on file cabinets in admin office.
- Repaired fire exit light in stairwell replaced 2 batteries.
- Repaired kneeler on pulpit side. All 3 screws were gone. If they work out again may need to move from #10 to #12 screw.
- Picked up the remaining caster and continued work on new chair storage rack.
- Mounted groundbreaking shovel. Need to get a plaque made as the details become more clear.
- Discussion with Pastor Kristin and Andrea on issues arising from space rental. Have a plan going forward.
- Fellowship Hall discussion. Paint and professional sound deadening. Pastor Kristin has paint color selection item. Will need to investigate sound deadening solution.

Looking ahead, it appears that the two trees on the left of the exit are both dying. The pine has many dead branches and small patches of needles, and the other tree is mostly dead limbs as well. Will keep an eye out but will likely need to be removed in next 2 years.
