

A free event on February 17, 2024 Synod Educational Meeting for Council Members in Bethesda, Maryland led


by Bishop Ortiz and John Van De Weert. Pastor Kristin is encouraging council members to attend.

WOMEN of the ELCA: Holy Trinity's WELCA group met on Tuesday, January 9th for our first meeting of 2024. Eight members plus Pastor Kristin worked together to pack 16 lunches/waters for our continued support of Loudoun's homeless shelter. Kim

Mill kindly delivered these to Shelter House on a very rainy morning. Deb Wenk led the group through "Holy Losses and Holy Invitations" (chapter 4) for our book study of Alice Fryling's Aging Faithfully. An open and frank discussion followed. As treasurer, Margaret Seymour, brought us up to date on our financial/offering status and the members present agreed to donate \$255 for items chosen from the ELCA Good Gifts catalog. In the past WELCA has chosen to donate livestock to the overseas mission, but discussion this year focused on choices that directly benefited women and children. We were pleased to authorize Margaret to purchase the following as gifts from HTLC's Women of the ELCA:

- \*clinic visit for a child
- \*vaccinations for a child
- \*stocking of a health clinic for a month

- \*attendance for a woman to farmer's field school

As we have done each Fall with school kits, our group discussed another overseas mission project through the ELCA or Lutheran World Relief programs. As an Easter congregational outreach, WELCA is considering sponsoring "Ten chicks for \$10". From the ELCA catalog - "Ten little chicks can make a big difference. Eggs from chickens not only provide an ongoing supply of protein-rich meals for a family, they can also launch a small business that provides a steady source of income." Keep your eyes and ears open!

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, February 13 and all are welcome. (We will be continuing with our bag lunch ministry, book study, and likely helping to set-up for the Shrove Tuesday dinner that evening.)

### Financial Update

First and foremost, we express our gratitude for contributing to the success of our operating expenses last year. As you are aware, we are facing urgent needs for a new air conditioner and a new roof. The estimated cost of the new roof is \$150,000,



and our reserve fund currently stands at \$6,950. The air conditioner for the Pastor's office and surrounding areas requires replacement by April, with a cost of \$15,000, and we presently have \$8,989 in the reserve fund.

While we actively explore solutions for these crucial needs, we seek your support without compromising our ongoing operating expenses.

Following the congregational meeting, you will find thermometers placed inside the church, indicating the progress of the air conditioner fund, the roof fund, General Operating Expenses and weekly updates on each.

If you are interested in becoming part of the Finance Team, we welcome your involvement. Please reach out to Karla McGovern.

Once again, thank you, and let's not only sustain our efforts but strive to make them even more substantial and impactful than before.
