April is the month that Social Ministry will work together to support the above organization, Mobile Hope.

Mobile Hope, works to change the Social Determinants of Health for children and young adults (24 years of age and younger) who are precariously housed, homeless and at risk, living in Loudoun County. They create pathways for this fragile, overlooked and often unacknowledged population to have access to daily essentials and life changing support.

This month we will concentrate on collecting the following items of need for their programs of support. We are asking your help in collecting the following items:

Canned tuna, Canned Chicken, Granola bars, Canned fruit, Cereal, Canned Veggies, Macaroni and Cheese, Hearty soups, Snacks and Peanut Butter Crackers. Please place your donations in the "Golden Cart".











From Our President

While discussing the financial aspects of HTLC isn't something I particularly enjoy, as your President, I feel it's my responsibility to keep you informed about our



church's operational needs. I deeply appreciate everyone's contributions thus far, and I know each of you has already been incredibly generous. However, I believe our main challenge

lies in maintaining consistency.

First, let me share some positive news. Our congregation has once again demonstrated its generosity by funding a new air conditioner for the office area. Mat Shultz and I extend our heartfelt gratitude to all who contributed to this endeavor.

In terms of our financial performance, January and February were relatively stable, with all bills being covered. However, March presented some challenges. At one point, we only had \$1,000 in the bank, which wasn't sufficient to cover our weekly expenses. Thankfully, the following week, our funds increased to \$5,000, enabling us to pay some bills. Yet, we still faced a shortfall of

\$18,000 to cover the remaining expenses within a tight 11-day period. We prayed earnestly for Easter services to provide the necessary financial support.

To sustain our operations, we require \$40,000 monthly, while our budget indicates a need for \$30,000, leaving us to cover the majority of bills each month. This disparity is partly due to increased utility costs, as our electric and gas bills have risen significantly. Additionally, we've provided well-deserved raises to our staff, some of whom hadn't received increases in over a decade.

For instance, our electric bill now exceeds \$2,000 monthly, with further increases anticipated during the summer when giving typically decreases. Our gas bill has also surpassed \$1,000 monthly. Despite these challenges, we're actively seeking ways to reduce costs, such as changing service providers to save \$319 monthly and exploring other avenues for savings.

Moving forward, I'll regularly update you on our weekly and monthly giving through signage, the Bulletin, and the Tidings. Your contributions, both financial and through your time, are invaluable to the life of our church. Thank you for your unwavering support.

As an extension of WELCA's own support of the ELCA Good Gifts program, we joined with Little Blessings Preschool to sponsor this outreach fundraiser. To our great surprise and delight, we had 41 families or individuals donate \$1000 to provide for the purchase of a thousand chicks to be used both as meals and a source of income for families overseas.





Toin us for a great afternoon of entertainment


Join us for a great afternoon of entertainment with this classic Broadway smash hit.
